LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR



AS ALWAYS, I SIT TO WRITE THIS REPORT from a place of extreme gratitude. Every day, I work with bright talented people who are genuinely happy to be here. Every day, I see children laughing and playing with their friends. I also see them hard at work focusing on new skills with the support of their mentors. I see young adults pushing their bodies to new levels of strength and self-awareness. I see older adults moving their bodies for the first time in years or healing the wounds of trying to move in spaces that did not accept them as they are. I see people learning patience as they create together with people who are different from themselves. I see a space full of people with endless possibilities.

In 2024, Gainesville Circus Center produced 7 professional shows and 11 youth showcases in addition to several community events and collaborative productions. Among our professional events was the last season of the Dusty's Ragtime Circus. The performance was beautifully executed at the Phillip's Center for Performing Arts. After a 7-year run, it is time to make way for new creative projects. We also hosted the 3rd edition of CircusPalooza, a dynamic rock-and-roll concert with contemporary circus. Despite Hurricane Helene's best efforts to stop our production, the show went on!

New productions for 2024 included the first ever 2nd Street Circus Spectacular. The event featured indoor and outdoor stages, vendors and kids' activities at our facility in downtown Gainesville. The outdoor stage allowed us to showcase our flying trapeze program. The event was so successful, it has become our new annual winter event.

Gainesville Circus Center was invited to perform an opening for the TEDxGainesville event held at the Hippodrome State Theater. This performance consisted of an 8-minute contemporary aerial dance ensemble performance with original music by Xavi Leon and choreography by Corey Cheval and Isabel Brazzel.

Much of our success is due to the steady hard work of our core team members. Isabel Brazzel was promoted to Assistant Director and was recognized for outstanding performance by the Florida Afterschool Network annual conference in Orlando, Florida. Samantha Belmore has been promoted to Stage Manager and carries out myriad duties in

between events, including driving the circus bus, costume construction and coaching. As always, of course, there are several team members on their way out this year as their lives take them to new adventures, so we look forward to an exciting new cohort of trainees.

Last year we inaugurated the Parent's Guild, which is a forum for the parents of our youth students to be more directly involved in our organization. The parent's guild has provided much needed support coordinating volunteer staff for events. I am excited to see what all the Parent's Guild can accomplish in the coming season.

Despite the State of Florida's announcement to cut all funding to the arts and museums in the 2024-2025 cycle, our county partners have come through helping to bridge the gap in our budget. Visit Gainesville / Alachua County provided some additional funding for the current show season. The Children's Trust of Alachua County also maintains steady support including an annual cost of living increase to our program allowance. Additionally, the Gainesville Circus Center received its first Outside Agency grant from the City of Gainesville.

Nevertheless, we still have a lot of work to do to maintain a healthy budget in 2025. Gainesville Circus Center continues to prioritize making the arts accessible to all despite economic barriers and provide a living wage to its team members. Gainesville Circus Center plans to offer benefits packages including health insurance, PTO and 401k plans for all full-time employees in 2026. This will not be easy, but we are determined to make it a reality.

As we enter an era of economic uncertainty, I am perhaps foolishly confident we will continue to thrive. I expect our community to work together to sustain this cultural gem of an organization. We couldn't do it without you!

2024 IMPACT + FISCALS

GAINESVILLE CIRCUS CENTER

Gainesville Circus Center contributes to our community through youth development, recreation and performing arts. GCC is a place where budding young artists cultivate their talents and creativity with a supportive network guiding them through the process of becoming professional artists. Furthermore, GCC contributes to the cultural landscape of Alachua County with original productions of circus-based performance art. GCC contributes to our local economy by providing jobs and childcare for local families. In the past year, GCC provided over 1000 hours of childcare while serving 15 scholarships per semester. Our scholarship families saved, on average, \$700/month in childcare services. In 2024, GCC paid over \$264,000 in wages and professional fees to our diverse team of educators and administrators (roughly \$30,000 more than 2023). This figure covers 4 full-time team members, 6 regular part-time team members and several seasonal or event-based team members.

Half event attendees were first time audience members at GCC events.

65%

Although more than half of our audience members say they wouldn't change a thing about our events, a significant number of our patrons indicated a desire for more with specific mention of more vendors, more performances, and more advertising.

Audience members report positive feedback regarding the following aspects of our performances:

- 18.9% everything
- 9.6% aerial acts
- 8% variety
- 13.1% music
- 12.5% youth performances
- 9.9% dance / Choreography
- 25.6% other

When asked if there was anything else event attendees would like to add, the majority of responses expressed appreciation for the circus center, staff, and performances. Respondents highlighted the supportive and safe environment for children. Several responses emphasized the importance of community and artistic expression.

Our classes range from recreational circus fitness to professional training for aspiring circus artists. Our youth program consists of afterschool circus with transportation from local public schools, daily drop-in classes, school holiday camps and 6 weeks of summer camp. Our adult program features recreational fitness and artistic training in circus and world dance. Additionally, we offer a monthly rotation of guest artist master classes with exclusive training opportunities for GCC staff.

GCC's annual Circathon fundraiser involves students and staff setting circus goals for the week of Circathon and collecting pledges from friends and family members to support them as they meet those goals. We also hold monthly bake sales during the school year with the support of our Parent's Guild and encourage donations at our live shows. We are always looking for volunteers to help intensify our fundraising efforts.
